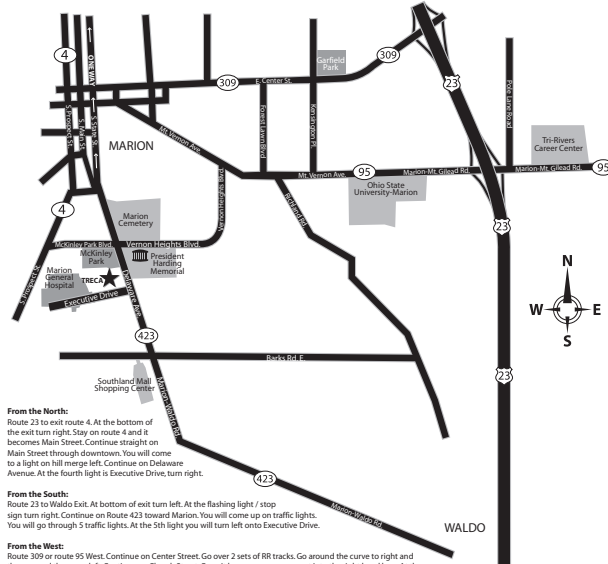

From the North:
Route 23 to exit route 4. At the bottom of the exit turn right. Stay on route 4 and it becomes Main Street. Continue straight on Main Street through downtown. You will come to a light on a hill merge left. Continue on Delaware Avenue. At the fourth light is Executive Drive, turn right.

From the South:
Route 23 to Waldo Exit. At bottom of exit turn left. At the flashing light / stop sign turn right. Continue on Route 423 toward Marion. You will come up on traffic lights. You will go through 5 traffic lights. At the 5th light you will turn left onto Executive Drive.

From the West:
Route 309 or route 95 West. Continue on Center Street. Go over 2 sets of RR tracks. Go around the curve to right and then around the curve left. Continue on Church Street. Once it becomes a one way get into the right hand lane. At the second light Main Street turn right. You will come to a light on a hill merge left. Continue on Delaware Avenue. At the fourth light is Executive Drive, turn right.

From the East:
Route 308 East. Continue through downtown. Turn left onto Main Street. You will come to a light on a hill merge left. Continue on Delaware Avenue. At the fourth light is Executive Drive, turn right.

From Tri-Rivers Career Center (previous TRECA office):
Route 95 East becomes Mt Vernon Avenue. Continue on Mt Vernon Avenue. You will pass several restaurants, shopping centers and Marion Catholic High School. Once you pass Marion Catholic High School you will turn left on Vernon Heights Blvd. At the light you will turn left onto Delaware Avenue. Get into the right hand lane. At the next light turn right onto Executive Drive.

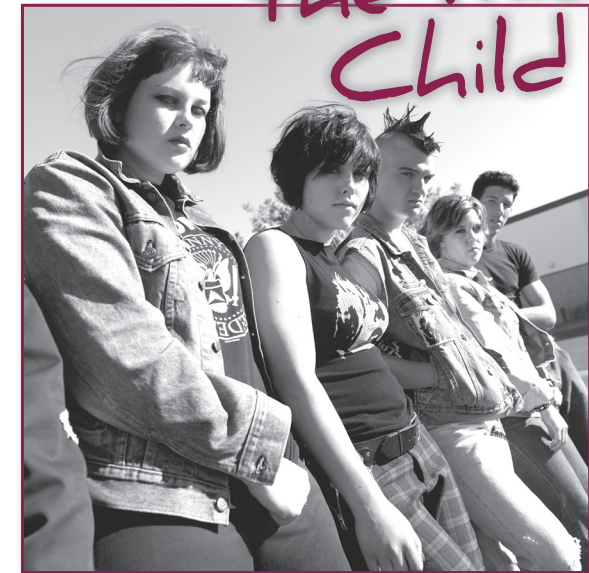

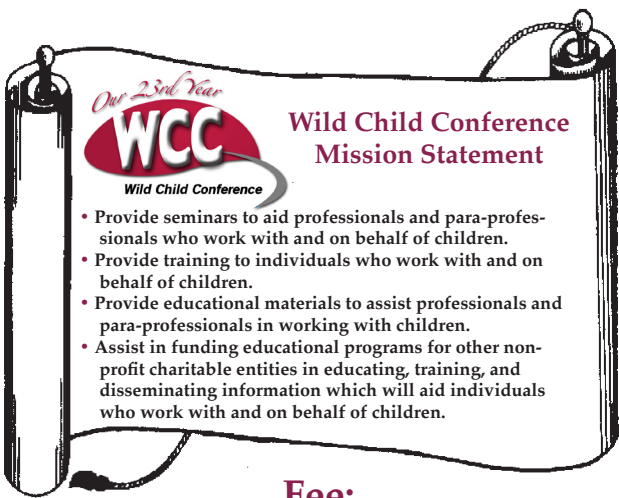

Keynote Address

Shianne Eagleheart - LICDC, ICCS
 Shianne Eagleheart (Haudenosaunee-Seneca) is a Native American Ceremonial Leader, Professional Trainer, Ordained Minister, and Executive Director and Founder of The Red Bird Center, Inc., a non-profit, Earth-based Healing Center located in Southeastern Ohio. The Center provides opportunities for healing, education, and community celebration. Shianne has been providing community training on this "Healing Center Model" throughout the United States and abroad since 1999.

Keynote Address: *The Wounded Bear—A Modern Day Medicine Story About Hope & Healing*

A medicine story is a Native American term that describes the healing effect a story can have on the listener. This medicine story shares the blueprint needed in our society to heal the violence and heartbreak in our communities.

Healing Family Violence
 Participants will explore the impact violence has on the family and what is necessary for healing to begin. This workshop will outline the stages of healing and concrete steps to resolve family conflict using a strength-based model.

 Janice has worked as clinical director at Comprehensive Care Corporation, Assistant Treatment Manager at Franklin County Children's Services and as an outpatient and crisis therapist at Worthington Community Counseling Services and Netcare Corporation. With over 23 years clinical experience working with children, families, and adults, she helps bring them wellness and success.

The Overindulged Child
 Oppositional Defiant Disorder and Conduct Disorders are reaching epidemic levels in the United States. According to James A. Fagerty,

ED.d., and others, over-indulgence is one of the major contributors to these pervasive and difficult to treat syndromes. Overindulgence has been described by many as a form of child neglect; robbing the child of the necessary emotional and behavioral skills that allow them to mature into productive and mature adults. This class will examine the factors of over-indulgence and how to spot it in caregivers and their children. Tips and techniques to help parents make better choices regarding over-indulgence will also be discussed.

Jacqueline Ringer, MPA, LSW
 Jacqueline Ringer is the director of Marion County Children Services. For the past 12 years, she has worked in various areas of child welfare including investigations, foster care and adoption case management and family support services.

Why it Truly Takes a Community to Protect a Child

When Marion County Children Services intervenes in the lives of families, or when they do not, can be a daunting process to understand for those not familiar with child welfare practice. Such confusion leads to misconceptions about the agency.
