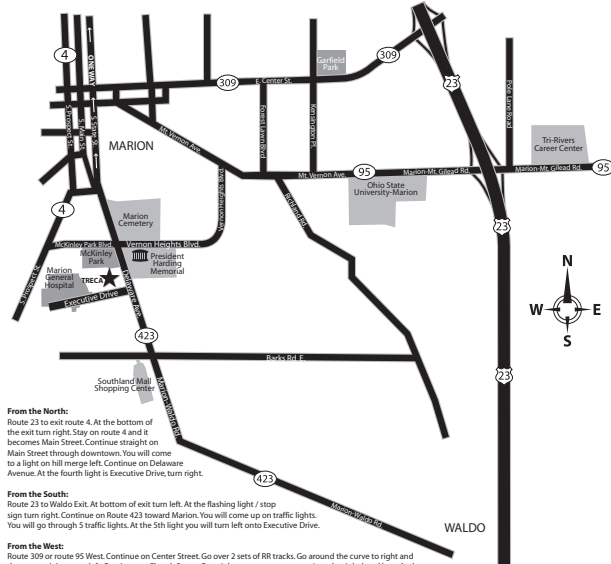

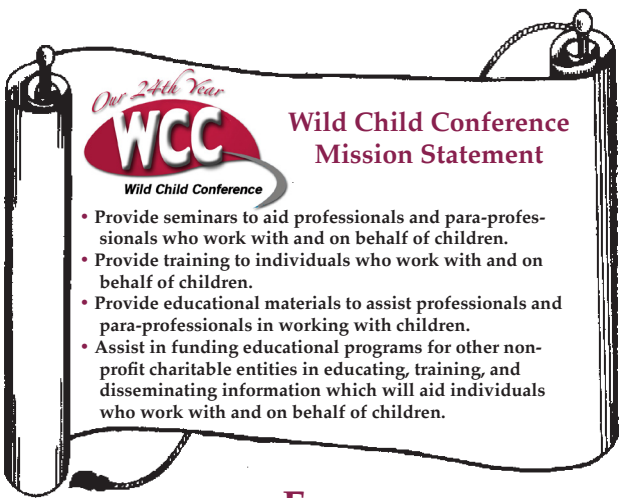

Currently, as president of Morabeto Mind Legacy Associates, Inc., an independent training and consulting company, she develops and delivers workshops relating to mental health and therapeutic modalities in both onsite and online formats. She is a program consultant for Mental Health America of Franklin County, Professor at Ashland University, and holds certification in Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, Neurolinguistic Programming, and Hypnotherapy.

Course Description

Overindulging children and teens takes many forms, from giving them too many material items to allowing them privileges they haven't yet earned, and can even include patterns of behaviors in families that seldom, if ever include the use of NO!

The complications of overindulging children can be severe and include symptoms of conduct disorder, such as ego-mania, anger and aggression, and excessive dependency.

This workshop will discuss overindulgence, the cognitive distortions frequently seen in adults who partake in these behaviors as well as interventions for home, school, and the counselor's office!

Morning Sessions

- **Introduction of trainer and course.**
- **Overindulgence definitions.** Too much stuff, too much freedom, too much for kids is just too much!
- **Current research regarding impact on personality formation, communities, and society at large.** Are we raising yet another generation of entitled, ill mannered, lazy, and unproductive kids? Do you really want these kids to "choose your nursing home?"
- **The loss of the mentoring parent.** Parents afraid to say NO!, SET LIMITS, MAKE KIDS EARN and LEARN!
- **Treatment strategy – Gratitude: Resiliency against overindulgence.** Teaching the essential art of wanting WHAT you HAVE!

Afternoon Session

- **Types of overindulgent parents.** Do you deal with parents who are blind to their children's faults, glorify their children in every way, and make it impossible for educators and the legal system to set and retain boundaries? Understand some reasons why and help them to consider other ways of parenting!
- **Distorted thinking patterns.** Getting to the heart of the matter: Twisted thoughts that help parents to feel guilty, disempowered, and detached from their often confused, angry, and depressed children.
- **Overindulgence related to enabling drug use in teens.** Empower parents to take charge by showing them the serious consequences of a laissez faire attitude to drug use in their children, teens, and young adults!

- **Traits of the mentoring parent.** Learn about and teach parents the mentoring mindset! Hugs, not toys. Know and teach children the difference between wants and needs, practice the fine art of saying NO, and knowing when enough is enough!
- **Strategies for helping parents to identify and stop overindulging.** Empower parents to be strongly focused on their jobs as guides and mentors by giving them permission, confidence, and motivation to be all they can be!
- **A tribute to great parenting.** Enjoy a fun video that will give you a way to learn and promote parenting that grows kind, tolerant, and hard working adults!

Closing Session

In her final session of *The Negative Impact of Overindulgence in Children*, Janice Morabeto will tie together how the dynamic between the overindulged child and the overindulgent parent can create a toxic relationship that may result in severe behavioral consequences.
